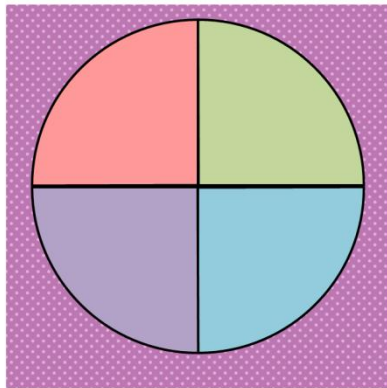

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Fluency Spin



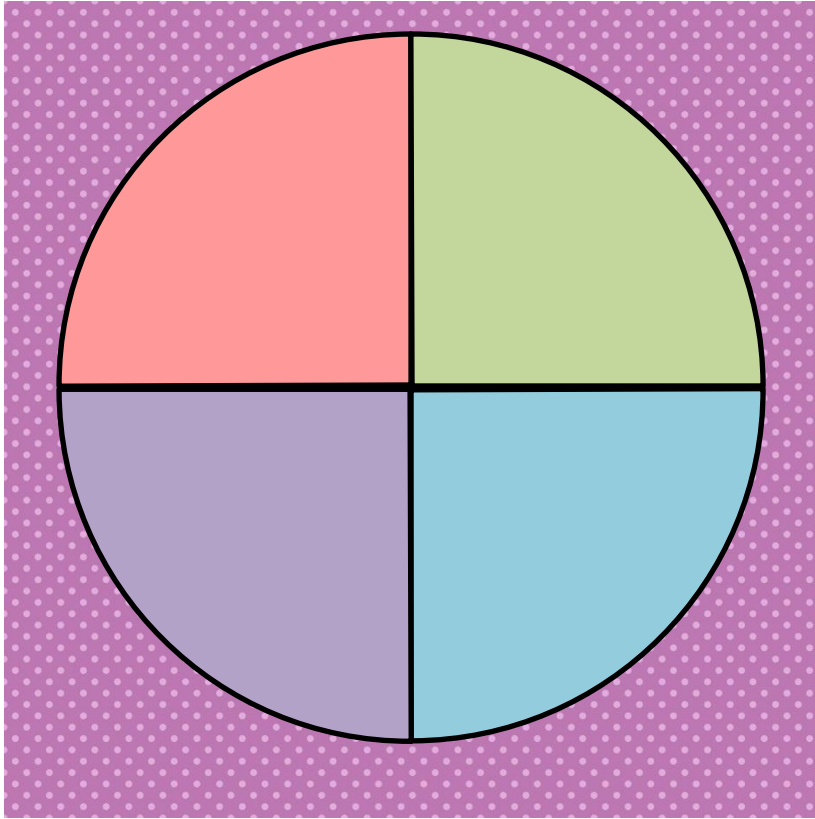
Students use the spinner to select a color on the fluency board to read. If read correctly, they get to place one of their markers on that phrase. However, if another student spins that same color, they can choose to steal the spot from their classmate. The student with the most markers in play at the end of the time is the winner. Teachers can choose to use seasonal erasers, bingo chips, coins or colored dry erase markers to mark a student's spot.
