


Ideas for Materials

August/September

You want your first sensory item to be something that is simple to manipulate and clean up. This will be your students' first experience with the sensory table and the time when you establish expectations and routines. Simple is always your best bet.

- Colored pasta (primary colors for this month) in several types and colors (see instructions for dying). These can be used as a base item or have students scoop up a lodle full and sort by color and type.
- Colored sand (Crayola makes some that is very reasonable by the end of the summer season) makes a great base.
- Interesting paper, newspaper, wall paper samples and so ssolit and/or paper punchers. You
 will be surprised how many of your students have it had the experience of just cutting and
 how invaluable it will be to build fine motor skills.
- Play-doh with an apple cinnamon scen. It a secony table, why not enlighten their sense of smell.

- Add magnetic letters to your at le or sand and magnet v and. Have students sort the





Sort the letters in the table by capitals and lowercase.








