This product is designed for introducing and practicing the AG word family. It includes 52 pages of differentiated and aligned word work activities. The activities are designed to be used for morning work, homework, or independent practice. They are suitable for students who have mastered their letter sounds and are ready to begin learning word families.

The word work activities include:

- Write the Room: Students search the room for words from the AG word wall.
- Find the Words: Students find words from the AG word wall in their environment.
- Look at my Word Wall: Students look at a word wall and identify words from the AG word family.
- What is in the Bag? Students identify words from the AG word family in a bag.
- Stand for the AG word: Students stand for words from the AG word family.
- Write the AG word: Students write words from the AG word family.
- Homework/Morning work: Extra practice morning work or homework options.
- Color, count and then write all the -ag word pictures below: A worksheet for students to color, count, and then write words from the AG word family.
- Color, count and then write all the -ag word pictures below: Another worksheet for students to color, count, and then write words from the AG word family.
- Find the AG word: Students find words from the AG word family in a box.
- Find the AG word: Another worksheet for students to find words from the AG word family.
- Find the AG word: Yet another worksheet for students to find words from the AG word family.
- Find the AG word: A final worksheet for students to find words from the AG word family.
- Make it-Write it: Students make words from the AG word family.
- Make it-Write it: Another activity for making words from the AG word family.
- Make it-Write it: A third activity for making words from the AG word family.
- Make it-Write it: A fourth activity for making words from the AG word family.
- Word Family Make a Book: An activity where students practice reading word family words while playing a fun interactive game. This word family word book is in a small pocket chart. Behind one word card is a picture. When you pull the tab, the word disappears and the student has to believe the picture is hidden. If they guess correctly, they get to hide the card again. You can use cards from many word families or just one word family.
- Word Family Make a Book: Another activity for word family words.
- Word Family Make a Book: A third activity for word family words.
- Word Family Make a Book: A fourth activity for word family words.
- Introducing the -AG family: The first day of the week when learning a new word family, use the placards to make the words as a whole group. This is a very kinesthetic and engaging activity for young learners. Hand out only the placards you will need to make words for that week's word family.
- Introducing the -AG family: Here are the letters you will need for the -AG family: a, g(2), r, e, s, w, d, f, i, s, n.
- words you will be making:  
wag, fog, gag, rag, sag, bag.  
Depending on the readiness of students you can also add: trap, drop, flag, snap, snap.

**Write The Room**  
Laminate, cut apart, and mount the write the room cards below with masking tape around your room. Based on your students' readiness levels, select a recording sheet for them to use. You may either laminate these (my preferred method) or print them off to use with a pencil if you prefer. Hand your student a clipboard and have them search the room for the word family pictures. For students who have not progressed towards mastering their letter sounds quite yet, have them write the words from the word wall for practice (see "write the word wall" response sheet).

**Match the Pictures**  
This is a fun game cards. Laminate and cut each card and secure with a paper clip or a clothespin. A student places the card on the mat next to the word with pictures, use play doh to make a dot on the letter that corresponds to the word. There are three sets of cards made to write the word on the mat same mat for all your word family. If a class completed, they can open the card to see what word it was.

**Match the Pictures**  
Each word family will include four cards for that word family. There are two different ways to choose this depending on the readiness of your students. Students use the self-correcting cards to make sure they are matching the correct word. You may also want to reinforce this activity. The blank section can use magnetic letters, wikki stix, playdoh and letter stamps or beads. Be creative with your materials to keep this station interesting. As you introduce more and more word families, the station will grow with it and provide tons of word work practice. The next two pages are the same mats that you will use for all the short 'a' word families.

**Write About Word Families**  
Groups of at least two words from the word family, use them in a sentence or two and then draw the something word you used.


**Rhyming**  
Find words from the word family that rhyme.

**Write the Word Family Wall**  
Write the word family words.

**Word Family Ideas**  
This activity gives your students an opportunity to practice reading word family words while playing a fun interactive game. Your students will need to find a word card that has the picture above. Students then point out word cards where the picture is hidden. If they guess correctly, they get to hide the card back in the box. This can be used to record their own word families. This can be used to record their own word families.

**Small Playing Cards**  
Memory match: These small playing cards are useful for playing memory like to do it either a small word card like the end of the word or the beginning of the word. They can also be used to play a memory game. Students can play this game individually, in pairs or in small groups. Students can lay out their cards and then place it under the correct word family or in the correct word family corner. It is a matching activity in my word family word wall.

This unit contains 52 pages of activities for introducing and practicing the AN word family.

**Content:**

- Word Family Mats & Mats:** Students cut out the mats with a straight or wavy blade or the wavy words on the mats. They can write words they know or make up new words. There are 5 different mats for the AN family.
- I Can Read:** Students cut out the word strips and read them through the hole at the bottom of the page.
- Homework/Morning work:** Extra practice for morning work or homework. Includes word search puzzles, word cards, and writing practice for the AN word family.
- Say It-Make It-write It:** A recording sheet for self-correcting cards. Students can either write or draw each word on the lines provided. There are two different ways to choose from depending on the needs of your students.
- Playdough Mats:** Students can use playdough to make the letters for each word. You can use magnetic letters, wiggly words, and other options to make it creative with your materials to keep your students engaged.
- Small Playing Cards:** These are the cards you will use for matching memory. You can print them off to use with a pencil if needed. You can laminate these (my preference) or print them off to use with a pencil if needed. I have them write the words and wait for practice (see "write the response sheet").
- Memory Matching Games:** These are for matching memory. You can do this in a center or a pocket chart. I like to do this in a center as a predictable chart is the first thing target, but you can really do anything you have a flat space. This is a traditional memory with students matching the word with the correct corresponding picture.
- Word Hunt:** This is a fun game where students can hunt for their word family words hidden around the room. You can hide the word families in boxes, under desks, or in a basket. You can also have them go back to the basket and guess what word family they are.
- Memory Match Game:** This is a game where students can match up their word family words. You can use the cards included for more words or add words that are introduced by month or season.
- Write The Word Family Wall:** Students can write the words in the boxes and then draw a picture to go with it. This is a good writing activity for the month of March.
