

Laminate, cut apart, and mount the write the room cards below with masking tape around the room. Based on your students' readiness, select a recording sheet for them to use. 





Each word family unit includes a set of self-correcting cards for that word family. There are two different sets to choose from depending on the needs of your students. Students use the self-correcting cards to make the affricate independent. You can use a variety of materials to make the cards. You can use felt squares, use magnets and velcro dots, paperclips, pushpins and more or beads. Be creative with your materials to keep this affricate interesting. As you introduce more and more word families, this affricate will grow with it and provide hours of word work practice. The next few pages are the same sets that you will use for all the short /u/ word families.

Small Playing Cards

Memory Match: These small playing cards are used for memory matching. Like to do this in either a small pocket chart or the last Target. If they are self-correcting, a student places the card on their desk. If it is not, they can make the word with pegs/pins, use playdough to make the word, or use letter tiles. If they are self-correcting, they can use this same set for a quick matching. Say It-Make It activities. Once completed, they can place the card back where it belongs.

Sorting: These are also the cards you will use for sorting word families since we have introduced many word families. To help find the sorting bases of the end of the word, you can use a pocket chart or use a file folder and label them with the base words. If you are using a pocket chart, you can use a color coding system for sorting. If you are using a file folder, you can use an eraser tab and tie it with a piece of tape, or just use a clothespin. If you are using a file folder, just use a clothespin or whatever you can find that is thematic or has the word family in the name. This is a favorite activity in my room. Here is a recording sheet if you need one.
